From the Executive Director



As we compiled this Annual Report and reflected on this past year, from July 1, 2022 to June 30, 2023, I continue to be filled with gratitude for the dedication and passion displayed by our Bethesda **Urban Partnership (BUP)** team, and I am also excited for the future of downtown

Bethesda. BUP is proud of the work we do to promote and maintain the downtown as one of the most vibrant destinations in our region. Guided by our Board of Directors, we are very fortunate to serve a community of hard-working retailers, restaurants and local businesses that have made our downtown successful. Complemented by new and longtime residents, we are continually looking for new ways to bring excitement and livability to our downtown.

In early 2023, we began the process to complete our next five-year Strategic Plan. This important Plan comes together with feedback from our constituents including residents, visitors, business owners, developers and our County partners. Several round table discussions were held, and an online survey was available and promoted to the community at large. During the summer of 2023, we welcomed some new initiatives including Free Fitness in the Parks at Elm Street Park and Concerts for Kids at the Bethesda Streetery.

Additionally, we enjoyed seeing many local residents and visitors enjoying the Bethesda Fine Arts Festival, Summer Concerts, Bike to Work Day, Bethesda Outdoor Movies and more. The annual "Savor Bethesda" Restaurant Week proved to once again be a favorite program for our residents and restaurants alike.

"Paint the Town" welcomed a new mural on the Old Georgetown Road/Woodmont Avenue parking garage in downtown Bethesda. Through a partnership with the Montgomery County Department of Transportation, Maryland-National Park and Planning and the Bethesda Arts & Entertainment District, we were honored to have local artist The Jah One enhance this public space with his original art entitled, "New Day."

Development continues to progress in downtown Bethesda and Marriott International opened its corporate headquarters and new hotel in the summer of 2022. Additionally, the Avocet and AC Hotel opened while other projects such as 7500 Old Georgetown Road, 4915 Auburn Avenue, 7000 Wisconsin Avenue and the Metro Tower at the corner of Wisconsin Avenue and Hampden Lane are all well underway.

As we celebrate our achievements over the last year, we are looking forward to an exciting future for downtown Bethesda. We will continue to focus on our community of residents, local businesses, developers and artists as we work towards the best Bethesda and fulfilling our motto of "A World in One Neighborhood."

The BUP team maintains the public spaces in downtown Bethesda and creates initiatives and marketing programs to welcome and engage residents, visitors and artists as well as promotes local businesses.

A dynamic neighborhood within the Greater Washington, D.C. area, Bethesda offers a variety of restaurants, retailers, entertainment venues and events. BUP's marketing team manages unique and exciting programming, including community festivals and arts events, as well as highlights the many destinations throughout the downtown. BUP also manages field operations, Bethesda Transportation Solutions (BTS), the Bethesda Arts & Entertainment District and the Bethesda Circulator.

BUP is operated by an eleven member Board of Directors comprising residents, businesses and developers appointed by the County Executive. The organization is funded primarily by revenue generated from the Bethesda Parking Lot District fees, in addition to the commercial Urban District property tax. Private sponsors partner with BUP on events such as Taste of Bethesda, Summer Concerts and the Bethesda Fine Arts Festival.

Bethesda Circulator

The Bethesda Circulator is a helpful mode of transportation for those looking for an easy and free way around town. The buses are on route Monday-Friday, 7am -11pm and Saturday, 10am -11pm. The route services north to Battery Lane and south to Bradley Boulevard and includes 20 stops at popular Bethesda destinations including the Metro, public parking garages, restaurants and shops. In 2023, Bethesda Transportation Solutions introduced a new Circulator App that tracks the real-time location of the buses along the route.

The dedicated BUP Maintenance Team removes trash, sweeps streets, mends sidewalks, trims trees, plants flowers, and more to keep the downtown refreshed and inviting. Always an important task, the team continued to brighten Bethesda during a time when there was an increased emphasis on outdoor gathering.

Additionally, the team is charged with the upkeep of important public gathering spaces in downtown Bethesda including Veterans Park, located at the corner of Norfolk and Woodmont Avenues; and the Norfolk Avenue Streetery, located on Norfolk Avenue, between St. Elmo and Cordell Avenues. Residents and visitors alike enjoy these spaces for lunch, dinner, coffee dates and more. The Norfolk Avenue Streetery is also home to the weekly Summer Concerts and Bethesda's Winter Wonderland.

During FY'23, the maintenance team managed and pruned 1,200 trees, took care of 35,000 flowers and 180,000 sq. ft. of turf, as well as removed trash and litter seven days a week.



The team also assists with on-site needs at BUP events and manages maintenance requests at Gallery B, Studio B and Triangle Art Studios. The team is certified in First Aid, CPR and AED.

Ask Me Team

The Ask Me Team is on duty Wednesday – Sunday and can be found around town ready to help patrons. The Ambassadors are available to provide emergency assistance, give directions and assist with the downtown's maintenance needs. The team also helps at BUP's events and have been an integral part of managing The Streetery on Norfolk Avenue.



BUP's marketing team has the exciting task of promoting downtown Bethesda as a destination for dining, shopping, the arts and a place filled with the best amenities outside your front door for downtown dwellers. BUP's website, www.bethesda.org, e-newsletter, social media posts and free printed guides are great resources to learn more about the restaurants, retailers and venues throughout the downtown.

In the fall of 2022, the BUP team began working on planning for the future. As part of the reauthorization process with the Montgomery County Council, BUP is required to do a five-year Strategic Plan. As such, BUP contracted with Progressive Urban Management Associates (P.U.M.A.), a Denver-based real estate economics and planning firm specializing in strategic planning for downtown partnerships across the country.





To formulate the plan, several roundtable discussions were held in early 2023 with our constituents including downtown residents, visitors, local business owners, County partners and developers. Additionally, an online survey was conducted for feedback from the community-at-large and we received more than 1,200 responses. BUP worked closely with P.U.M.A. to write a Plan that positions downtown Bethesda for the future and sets the marketing, maintenance and mobility priorities for our team.

To promote Bethesda as an ideal home for people and businesses, BUP worked with the startup Vistity to create a virtual tour of downtown Bethesda and its amenities. This virtual tour, hosted on Bethesda.org, uses a mixture of drone footage and street-level photography to give users a 360-degree view of downtown Bethesda. The tour highlights venues and destinations in Woodmont Triangle and Bethesda Row while showcasing local restaurants and retailers, and arts venues.

The well-loved addition of the Norfolk Avenue Streetery that was introduced in June 2020 continued throughout 2022 and 2023, with special event programming, concerts, and plenty of seating for Bethesda residents and visitors to enjoy outdoor dining, happy hour and more in downtown Bethesda.

The popular Friday Summer Concerts continued into 2023, and attracted happy crowds who enjoyed live music, dinner and dancing to start the weekend. The summer season kicked off with AfroPop group Elikeh, followed by other popular local groups including The 19th Street Band and La Unica. New in 2023, was free Concerts for Kids on Friday afternoons!

Free Outdoor Movies returned to Woodmont Triangle for three nights in July 2022 showcasing a classic summer film, a favorite musical and a recent comedy.

Another new initiative for 2023 was the free Fitness in the Parks events held in Elm Street Park. In June and July, participants were invited to free classes with Barre3 Bethesda, Corepower Yoga, Urban Boxing Bethesda, Serpentine Dance Studios and Crossfit Bethesda. After class, participants could learn more about the studios and take home some custom swag!

Dogs were not left out of the fun! In partnership with Montgomery Parks, BUP hosted Yappy Hour and Pop-Up Dog Parks at Elm Street Park in October 2022 as well as the summer of 2023. The Maintenance and Ask Me teams constructed play areas for large and small dogs on both sides of the park's plaza. Dogs were able to run, play and socialize, while owners enjoyed music from local bands, and food from downtown Bethesda restaurants including Dog Haus Biergarten and Smoke BBQ. Local pet retailers Bone Jour, Bond Vet and Atlas Doghouse also participated in the Yappy Hour events.

Due to Hurricane Ian, BUP was unable to hold Taste of Bethesda in October 2022. However, the popular Savor Bethesda Restaurant Week was back for its third year. Restaurant Week ran from February 16-26, 2023 and featured great deals. Participating downtown restaurants offered special pricing at \$10, \$20 or \$35. BUP promoted the culinary week, encouraging patrons to check out the deals and support their favorite restaurants. We also had the opportunity to partner with FOX 5 DC, and bring some of our restaurants to their live shows for chef demonstrations and more promotion of our beloved restaurant community.









BUP continued its support of restaurants and retailers with the E-gift card Bethesda Bucks. The Bethesda Bucks program continued to grow, adding a dozen new participants and selling \$10,000 worth of gift cards used at local establishments.

Bethesda's Winter Wonderland made its return to Woodmont Triangle at the Norfolk Avenue Streetery on Saturday, December 3, 2022. Parents and children flocked to the Streetery to celebrate the holiday season from 1-4pm. The event began with an ice sculpting demonstration followed by choir performances from Academy of the Holy Cross, Chevy Chase Elementary, Our Lady of Lourdes, Stone Ridge School, Walt Whitman High School and Walter Johnson High School. As the groups sang seasonal classics, kids visited with Santa Claus and made crafts, while adults and children alike enjoyed hot drinks and sweet treats from vendors Dog Haus, Smoke BBQ and The Red Bandana Bakery.

The 2023 Local Writer's Showcase once again honored writers throughout Washington, D.C., Maryland and Virginia. Over 700 pieces were submitted to the Bethesda Essay, Short Story and Poetry Contests. Thirty-seven writers were recognized and \$5,350 in prize money was awarded. The top prize winners also received classes and memberships to The Writer's Center as well as had their work published in Bethesda Magazine.

On March 9, 2023 the Poetry Awards and Reading was held in person at The Writer's Center and featured readings by this year's winners as well as professional poets E. Ethelbert Miller, Adam Chiles, and KaNikki Jakarta. The Showcase continued on March 10th at The Hyatt Regency Bethesda with the Essay and Short Story Reading featuring this year's winners.

Produced by the Bethesda Urban Partnership, the Local Writer's Showcase was sponsored by Moco 360 Media (Bethesda Magazine) and The Writer's Center, with support also provided by The Trawick Foundation and Hyatt Regency Bethesda.

The state of Maryland designated downtown Bethesda as an Arts & Entertainment District effective July 1, 2002. Special tax incentives benefit artists, arts enterprises and developers that are located within the Bethesda Arts & Entertainment District, Downtown Bethesda received its third re-designation in July 2022 to continue its work in promoting the arts in downtown Bethesda.

Initiatives

The Bethesda Arts & Entertainment District produces high quality arts and cultural programming that benefits residents, businesses and tourists and supports the community's growth and vitality. Events produced by the Arts & Entertainment District highlight local artists, writers, filmmakers and performers and provide them opportunities to show their work in the community. These programs also



promote Bethesda's artistic and cultural resources and attract nearly 1,000 artists and more than 30,000 attendees each year.

A new "Paint the Town" mural on the Old Georgetown/ Woodmont Avenue Garage was completed by The Jah One, of Washington, D.C. in July 2022. This new mural entitled, New Day, is a portrait of the artist's mother to celebrate her and everything she has done for their family. According to The Jah One, "Too often we honor people when they aren't around to hear it. In a more relatable way, New Day, is about us coming out of a long historical pandemic. We lost a lot, and much has changed forever. Hopefully we spent our time in isolation thinking about what's truly important to us and now we are focused on those things with a new, more grateful perspective on the future."

This installment of "Paint the Town" was made possible thanks to partners including the Montgomery County Department of Transportation and the Maryland-National Capital Park & Planning Commission.

BUP manages Gallery B, a nonprofit art gallery that features monthly exhibits by regional artists, and hosts the exhibitions for the annual Bethesda Painting Awards and The Trawick Prize. The spring 2023 exhibit lineup began with "ScentS of it All," by the Art4Us Artists Coop. The lineup also included "Variety Show: A Photo Ensemble" by Creative Platform, a photography group featuring nine photographers, and exhibit [c'est l'art] by Michael Hyman, Susan Washington, Dana Ellyn and Al Code. In May, The Black Art Today Foundation exhibited their latest show, "Black Art: In the Presence of LIGHT."

BUP also manages Studio B and Triangle Art Studios, studio spaces that serve as both work and exhibit areas for local artists. Studio B features artists Linda Bartley Button, Judy Gilbert, Shanthi Chandrasekar and Sara Leibman. At Triangle Art Studios, visitors can find artists Maruja Quezada, Barb Siegel and Stephen Estrada.

Triangle Art Studios has a gallery space to feature the artwork of the resident artists as well as guest artists. In December 2022, Gallery Gifts Pop-Up Shop featured the work of 11 local craft artists, including 2D and 3D fiber artworks by Maria Simonsson, lathe-turned wood items by Jeff Struewing, and hand-painted cards and journals by Lynda Slayen. In May 2023, Barbara Mandel's, "Picturing Paris" explored Paris in oil paints reflecting her recent trip to France.

The Studios were also opened for a returning event, the Bethesda Art Walk. These popular events guide attendees between Triangle Studios, Gallery B, Studio B, and the Waverly Street Gallery, and allow guests to view the work in each space and speak directly to artists. The Arts & Entertainment District held Art Walks on September 9 and December 9, 2022, as well as, April 14 and June 9, 2023.







The 11th annual Bethesda Film Fest featured seven short documentaries made by local filmmakers. The selected films, including one by a young filmmaker, were screened at Imagination Stage on March 24 and 25, 2023. Each screening was followed by a Q&A session with the filmmakers, moderated by Andrea Passafiume, Associate Producer for the Tribeca Film Festival, and Jay Korff of WJLA-ABC7. The event was also generously supported by Bruce and Leslie Lane; Bernard Family Foundation; The Donohoe Companies; Jane Fairweather Team; Suzanne Firstenberg; The Greenhill Companies; David Goldberg; Lerch, Early, and Brewer; Jan McNamara; Oxman Studios and Wendy Susswein.

The Bernard/Ebb Songwriting Awards honors the region's best songwriters from Maryland, Virginia and Washington, D.C. Founded by Bethesda resident Cathy Bernard in honor of her uncle Fred Ebb, the annual contest awards a \$10,000 Grand Prize and a \$2,500 Young Songwriter prize. The 2023 competition once again celebrated songwriting with a live concert at The Bethesda Blues & Jazz Club on April 21, 2023. The concert featured performances by the five grand prize and three youth finalists, and the winners were announced at the conclusion of the show.

The 18th annual Bethesda Fine Arts Festival welcomed 100+ artists to Bethesda's Woodmont Triangle along Auburn and Norfolk Avenues on Saturday, May 13 and Sunday, May 14, 2023. One of downtown Bethesda's largest events, this festival welcomes 20,000 annual attendees to browse and purchase original fine art produced by some of the country's most talented artists. Artists are juried into this festival, and travel to Bethesda from throughout the country. Featured artwork includes painting, photography, jewelry, sculpture, furniture, glass, ceramics and more. Festival goers are also entertained by live music, and can purchase food from downtown Bethesda restaurants while enjoying all of the original artwork.

The Trawick Prize: Bethesda Contemporary Art Awards final exhibit was on display at Gallery B September 8 - October 2, 2022. The show featured artwork by eight finalists who were selected by Alexis Assam, Regenia A. Perry, Assistant Curator of Global Contemporary Art at The Virginia Museum of Fine Arts (VFMA); Thomas James, Visual Arts Curator at Creative Alliance in Baltimore, MD; and Maria del Carmen Montoya, Assistant Professor of Sculpture and Spatial Practices, Director of Graduate Studies, M.F.A. in Fine Arts and Social Practice, Studio Arts Program.

In early spring 2023, a commemorative exhibit featuring winners of the past 20 years of The Trawick Prize was held at the American University Museum at Katzen Art Center. The Emerald Award was awarded to WonJung Choi, the 2022 The Trawick Prize "Best in Show" winner.

In June 2023, the 19th annual Bethesda Painting Awards, also founded by Bethesda resident Carol Trawick, was held at Gallery B from June 8 – July 2, 2023. Eight finalists were selected by the competition's panel made up of Lillian Hoover, artist, 2019 finalist of Bethesda Painting Awards, and 2012 Best in

Bethesda Transportation Solutions (BTS) was established in 2000 to help manage the traffic in downtown Bethesda by marketing local, state and federal commuter benefits programs and tax incentives to employers and local residents. BTS promotes multimodal transportation such as rail, bus, carpools and biking with the goal of reducing the number of Bethesda employees and residents who drive alone to work.

Each year BTS hosts one of the largest Bike to Work Day events in the Washington, D.C. region. The 2023 downtown Bethesda Bike to Work Day was almost back to pre-COVID-19 participation levels with cyclists, event table partners and speakers actively involved. There were over 470 registrants in Bethesda, the largest "Pit Stop" in Montgomery County. Several local businesses were onsite at the event including: BellRinger, Bethesda Green, Coalition for the Capital Crescent Trail, Griffin Cycle, Pedego Electric Bikes Bethesda, Potomac Pedalers, Silver restaurant, Terrapin Bicycles, The St. James Performance Club and the Washington Area Bicyclist Association.

Baked goods were donated by The Red Bandana Bakery and Bethesda Bagels. Silver restaurant provided coffee and yogurt parfaits, Eat the Change provided iced tea and

DrinkMore Water donated water. Prizes were donated by Fully Promoted, Griffin Cycle and Mon Ami Gabi.

The Walk & Ride Challenge tasks participants, including teleworkers, to incorporate walking into their day and were asked to record their steps. The top three teams were all from the employer American Society of Health-System Pharmacists. Individual participants also competed in weekly challenges to win prizes, including gift cards to local businesses.

The BTS Cool Commute Contest was a new event created by BTS in 2022 to encourage commuters to walk and bicycle to work during winter months. In 2023, commuters submitted 15 photo entries of their walking and biking commutes to win gift certificates. Participants provided positive feedback, stating that they walked and biked more often and enjoyed new bicycle lanes on Bethesda Avenue.



The BTS Earth Month Contest was a new event created by BTS in 2022 to encourage downtown Bethesda employees and residents to enjoy springtime in Bethesda with a focus on transportation themed places. The 2023 event centered on the Bethesda Circulator, with participants answering three detailed questions about the Circulator vehicles and stops. Two diligent commuters answered the questions correctly, winning gift certificates to local businesses.

BTS continued to assist employers with filing an online **Transportation Demand Management Plan with MCDOT**

(Montgomery County Department of Transportation). The team collaborated with The Greater Bethesda Chamber of Commerce and reached out to new employers to secure new and voluntary Plans. Additionally, the team connected with employers at several local Chamber events and meetings throughout the year to promote BTS services and secure new sponsors for BTS events. Each year, BTS nominates Bethesda employers to the Metropolitan Council of Governments, Commuter Connections Awards Ceremony for recognition of outstanding commuter benefits programs. In 2023, BTS and MCDOT received an award for outstanding outreach and assistance to Bethesda employers.

As part of the Developer Traffic Mitigation Agreements required by MCDOT, BTS provided transportation and commute information to properties in Bethesda. An electronic Bethesda transportation guide was sent to residential properties to encourage new residents to consider multimodal options in Bethesda. BTS also monitored pedestrian safety concerns associated with construction projects in Bethesda and communicated the information to the public.

BTS worked with MCDOT and MDOT to promote several new initiatives and updates in 2022-2023, including the County Bike Donation program, the County FareShare transit subsidy program, Bethesda adult bicycle education classes, the County Shared Streets program, Ride On service changes, MDOT Purple Line updates, separated bicycle lane construction in downtown Bethesda. BTS also helped promote Metro, parking and traffic updates.

BTS used direct mailing, emails, social media, an e-newsletter and their website to communicate with employers, commuters and property managers. BTS created an electronic "Bethesda Transportation Options" brochure for residential property managers highlighting downtown Bethesda transportation options. The BTS e-newsletter was sent to over 2,600 recipients each month.

On Car Free Day, which was held September 22, 2022, more than 4,000 people pledged to consider other transportation modes. This was an increase over last year's number of 2,993 pledges. Over the course of these various events, BTS usually assists over 2,000 commuters annually and places more than 25 people into carpools.
